## Local Cowboys Take Home Braggin' Rights at the Clovis Ranch Rodeo

(*Clovis, California*): Considered the top ranch rodeo in California, the Clovis Ranch Rodeo saw more than eighteen teams of cowboys and cowgirls from throughout the Central Valley compete for braggin' rights at the 12<sup>th</sup> annual event. They came to town to compete with their best horses; showing off the roping, riding, branding and reining skills that are a part of the ranching activities they do every day. Held today, the Clovis Ranch Rodeo kicked off a month of activities celebrating Clovis' western heritage leading up to the 98<sup>th</sup> Clovis Rodeo to be held April 26-29.

The day-long ranch rodeo competition included teams of four riders who each must use the same horse for all events. The winning four-person team made up of some past champions of the event went home with saddles that proclaimed them the Clovis Ranch Rodeo Champions for 2012. Taking home top honors were the new team of Don McCaslin, JW Brewer, Hec Hurley and Lee Whitney.

A sanctioned Western States Ranch Rodeo Association (WSRRA) event, the Clovis Ranch Rodeo is considered the best of the six ranch rodeos held in California attracting some of the best of the best who cowboy for a living. The WSRRA will film the Clovis event this year for promotional purposes; giving hardworking cowboys and cowgirls the added recognition they deserve. WSRRA gives the teams the opportunity to compete at a higher level of ranch-hand rodeo events. Clovis hosted several teams who have the intention of garnering points that will allow them to move on to the next level of competition where they will try for top honors amongst full time and part time working cowboys from major ranches throughout the West.

The 98<sup>th</sup> Clovis Rodeo opens on Thursday, April 26 with the return of one of the best shows on dirt, the PBR Bull Riding Touring Pro-Division, and some of the rankest bulls and toughest cowboys in bull riding followed by a concert with American Idol Winner David Cook. Friday Nights PRCA Rodeo action will be followed by a concert with rising country star Justin Moore. Two more days of wild rodeo action will follow along with the popular Clovis Rodeo parade on Saturday, April 28. The Clovis Rodeo runs April 26-29.
